Come aboard the Clyde's newest excursion ship, T.S.M.V. "Prince Ivanhoe". Enjoy a unique evening cruise from Greenock through the still waters of the Kyles of Bute to Tighnabruaich (where there will be time ashore for photographs, of course).

"Prince Ivanhoe" (ex "Shankliu", 833 g.t., built 1951) was the last British coastal excursion vessel to be built by Denny of Dumbarton, and the final member of a series of compact, broad-beamed screw passenger ships that Denny had developed over the previous 20 years (T.5.8. "Queen Mary" being an early example); indeed, in very many ways, she is a dissel corew version of P.S. "Caledonia" (1934). She is handsomely fitted out, with three large lounges, good catering facilities, a deck bar, full-length promenade deck and specious sun deck. A trip on her is a "mast" for any Clyde steamer enthusiast, and what better opportunity than an evening cruise through the Kyles?
